

Every child has the right to be able to go to school.

Help and support the educational work of the Presbyterian
Church of South Sudan.

Education is the key to a better life – particularly in a poor country like South Sudan. The Presbyterian Church of South Sudan (PCOSS) is campaigning to allow as many children as possible to take their opportunity and go to school.

South Sudan is one of the least developed countries in Africa. Only about a third of its 13 million inhabitants can read and write. That rate is even lower among women and girls. A lack of schools, teachers and teaching materials mean the level of education is extremely low. Church institutions are striving to maintain school operations in very difficult conditions. One such institution is the Presbyterian Church of South Sudan (PCOSS), a partner church of the Basel Mission German Branch.

## Better lessons make learning more fun

The PCOSS renovates classrooms and ensures that schools have sanitary facilities and clean drinking water. For teachers, the church provides further education in didactics, child

psychology and school administration. This improves the standard of teaching in schools – and with it the level of education. This, in turn, allows children to enjoy learning again. Thanks to psychological training, teachers are able to help their protégés to cope with traumatic experiences of war and violence.

## Schools provide areas of peace

The civil war, which has been ongoing since 2013, has denied many girls and boys the opportunity to attend school. Children living on the streets without any form of support are at particularly high risk of being recruited as child soldiers by the military. The PCOSS runs a children's home, which offers children at this kind of risk refuge, education and psychosocial support. According to the United Nations, 20,000 child soldiers have been recruited in the last four years. Their experiences of war often leave these children deeply traumatised. Former child soldiers and street children find a new home at the "Muhabba Centre" children's home, which is run by the PCOSS. They are given accommodation, food, an education, and psychological support.
